Fundamentals of Creating and Managing Digital Collections

NEDCC's conference on best practices and practical strategies for the creation, curation, and use of digital collections is presented annually.

ASSESSMENTS & CONSULTATIONS

An assessment helps jump-start your preservation program. The resulting comprehensive report can serve as the basis for future preservation initiatives and successful grant applications.

Preservation Needs Assessments

A Preservation Specialist will make an on-site visit and/or conduct a series of online meetings and produce a report that assesses overall collection management for physical collections; building and environmental conditions; storage, handling, and exhibit practices; security; and disaster preparedness.

Digital Preservation Needs Assessments

A Preservation Specialist will meet with stakeholders in person or online, then produce a report that addresses standards, best practices, and guidelines for digital collections; acquisition and management; rights and usage considerations; and institution-appropriate storage strategies.

Collection Assessments

Performed by an NEDCC format specialist, item-level and collection-level assessments focus on the condition of specific items in your collections.

Consultations

NEDCC Preservation Specialists and Conservators provide customized consultation services on collection storage and housing, exhibit practices, environmental monitoring, new building or renovation projects, emergency preparedness, and a range of other conservation and preservation issues.
